3RD GRADE: LOVE ONE ANOTHER

Third-grade students learned about the Christian value of "Love One Another." They focused on Jesus' teachings during the Last Supper, where He told His followers to love each other (John 13:34). Jesus knew tough times were coming – betrayal, trial, crucifixion, burial, and resurrection. He stressed the power of love in making His followers recognizable (John 13:35).

Students realized love isn't just a nice feeling; it's crucial in hard times. Jesus wanted His disciples to support each other. To bring Christian values into daily life, people should actively show love, compassion, and understanding, even when facing challenges. Jesus' example inspires Christians to express love not only in good times but also during difficulties.

"A way I can be kind is caring not about myself, but other people because Jesus says so." -Jetson Bosch

During our Bible lesson, the students created a heart weaving project. This artwork acts as a reminder of Christian values beyond the classroom, emphasizing the importance of love in daily life.

Practically, loving one another means being kind, empathetic, and forgiving. It involves helping others and creating a community where people support each other. Acts of kindness, big or small, show the love Jesus talked about, letting others recognize Christians by their love.
