# California Gold Rush Era

In this exciting writing assignment, students were tasked with crafting fictional narratives set in the California Gold Rush era. The prompt asked them to imagine a day in the goldfields, from dawn to dusk. They were encouraged to think critically about what would bring someone to California in search of gold, what their motivations might be, and what challenges they would face. Students used their creativity to describe the appearance of their camp, the people they met along the way, and the surprises they encountered in the rugged wilderness. This assignment allowed students to dive into the past and explore history through the lens of storytelling, which required them to think deeply about the setting, characters, and events that would shape their day.
