Biblical Worldview Scope and Sequence

The Biblical Worldview Scope and Sequence quantifiably states what students will be able to do by the end of the course. The curriculum uses themes to guide students through the content. Each theme has three corresponding statements that relate to the Creation, Fall, Redemption approach to the subject. The first statement identifies the practices that students will be engaged in. The second statement determines the fallen interpretation of those practices. Finally, the third statement presents a response to the fallen interpretation.

Justice

- Identifying ensuring justice as the chief obligation of government
- Evaluating events in U.S. history according to a biblical view of justice

Religion

- Assessing the role of the Christian religion in the development of American culture
- Tracing the growth of secularism in the history of American culture
- Proposing ways to resist secularism in daily life

Freedom

- Explaining the nature of true freedom; relating freedom to responsibility
- Evaluating various misunderstandings of freedom
- Proposing ways to live by a biblical understanding of freedom

Individualism

- Explaining the importance of both individuals and communities.
- Evaluating individualism and socialism
- Defending a biblical view of individuals and communities



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Equality

- Distinguishing between equality and justice
- Evaluating the injustices that arise from denying equality before the law
- Developing a biblical view of equality

Growth

- Relating the American ideal of growth to the Creation Mandate
- Evaluating actions Americans have taken in their pursuit of growth
- Developing a biblical view of growth
