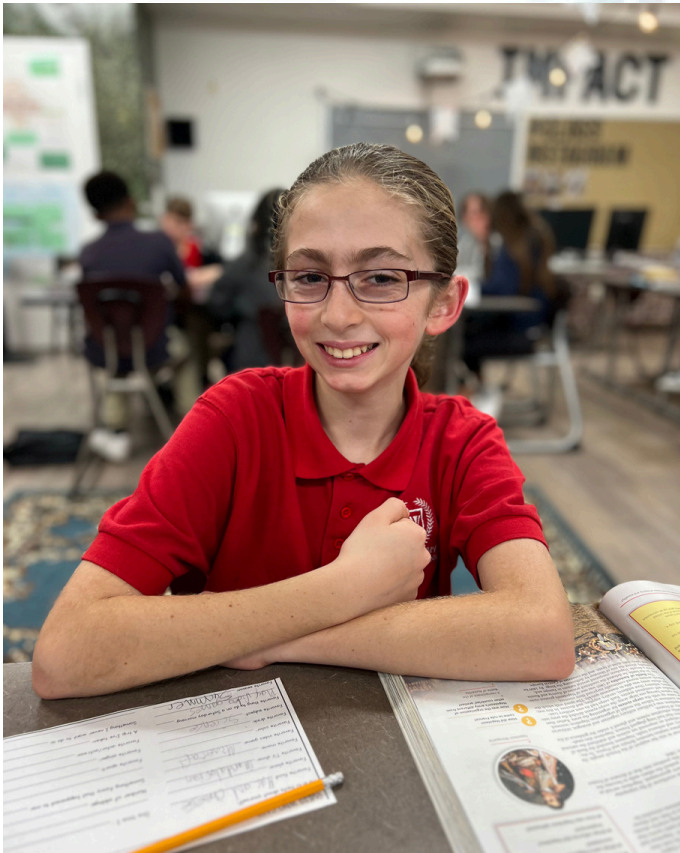
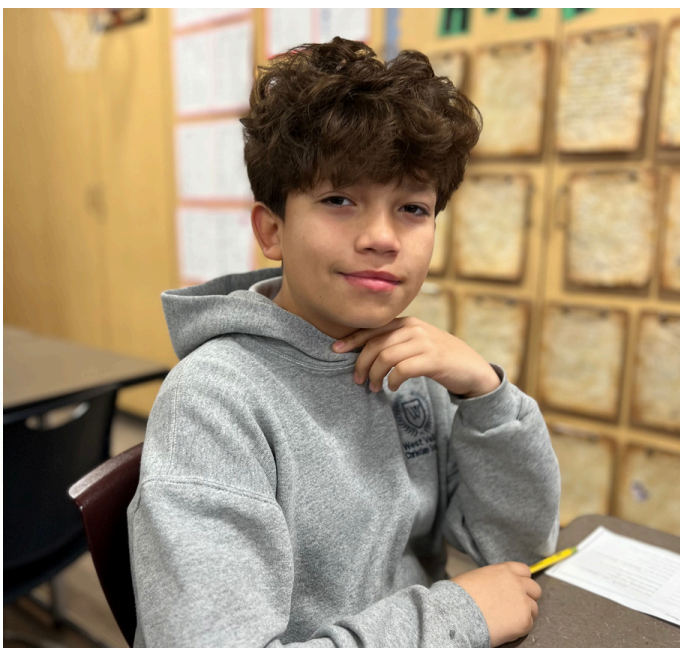


Revolution in the Classroom: Exploring the French Revolution
