Biblical Worldview Shaping in Pre-Algebra

Mathematics is not neutral. It is taught and learned from the perspective of a worldview. Our goal is to assist teachers in presenting math lessons in a way that helps students formulate and apply a biblical worldview of mathematics. In Pre-Algebra we explore the question, "What is a number?" through the 5 themes listed below. Each theme is considered in light of the big story of Scripture: Creation, Fall, Redemption.

Biblical Worldview Shaping Objectives

The relationship of BWS objectives to Bloom's Taxonomy is illustrated in the chart below. Biblical worldview shaping objectives are scaffolded throughout the text in Pre-Algebra. Each chapter level objective is supported by section objectives within the chapter. The theme and level of each chapter's biblical worldview shaping objectives are listed in the chart below.

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Design

- Creation: God designed us so that we could recognize His orderly handiwork in the world.
- Fall: Fallen people credit chance or their own mind for the obvious design seen through math.
- Redemption: Math helps us to see design and thank, praise, and glorify God for His wisdom.

Knowledge

- Creation: Numbering is part of our God-given work of naming.
- Fall: Fallen humanity views numbers as either objective truth or fully dependent on mankind.
- Redemption: Naming with numbers points us to God by helping us understand His works.

Reasoning

- Creation: We were created with a powerful capacity for reasoning and rational thinking.
- Fall: Fallen people view mathematical reasoning through deduction as a means of finding truth
- Redemption- Understanding the limitations of human reasoning, we look to God for truth.

Modeling

- Creation: God created us with the ability to make representations of the world.
- Fall: Fallen people attempt to obtain certainty or truth through mathematical models.
- Redemption: Models are useful and persuasive, but certainty comes only from God.

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Ethics

- Creation: Our task of subduing the earth is to be done in a way that honors God.
- Fall: Fallen humanity misuses numbers to harm or mislead others.
- Redemption: Using math in a way that shows a love for truth and our neighbors honors God.
