Below you will find some questions that students were asked during our lesson on penguins. These questions forced them to use their critical thinking skills and advance their learning.

**Developing Higher Level Thinking Questions:** 

**1.** Knowledge - What do penguins eat? Where do penguins live? How are penguins different from other birds?

2. Comprehension- How do penguins stay warm in the cold? Why can't penguins fly? Can you explain in your own words what a penguin's life is like?

3. Application- If you were a penguin, how would you protect yourself from danger? How can we take care of our environment, just like penguins take care of their homes?

4. Analysis- What are some challenges penguins face in their habitats? How do different types of penguins adapt to their surroundings? Why is it important for penguins to be excellent swimmers?
5. Evaluation - Why do you think penguins are important to the balance of nature? Which penguin adaptation do you find most interesting, and why?

6. How can we appreciate the beauty of God's creation in our everyday lives?

7. How does knowing God made both us and penguins uniquely beautiful and strong shape our self-perception?

8. In what ways can we protect and care for our surroundings, just like God cares for His creations?

9. How can we practice kindness and providing for others, inspired by God's provision for even small animals? Witness the joy of these young presenters, setting a foundational appreciation for God's magnificent creation and paving the way for future exploration in the years to come.
