

LEARNING KINDNESS THROUGH GOD'S STORY

In preschool Bible time, our students listened to the story of the Good Samaritan, a powerful lesson about kindness, empathy, and compassion. Together, they observed how the men who were supposed to help chose to walk away, while the one who was least expected to show kindness stopped to care. This opened the door for meaningful conversations about what it means to love your neighbor.

Teachers invited students to ask open questions like, "Should I be kind to someone who isn't kind to me?" or "Should I help someone who is hurt, even if they're not my friend?" These observations and questions help even our youngest learners begin to connect God's Word to their daily lives.

Throughout the day, our preschoolers practiced kindness in the classroom by sharing, helping, and encouraging their friends. These "heart check" moments are gentle reminders that God calls us to be kind no matter who we are or how others treat us.

It is such a joy to see our little ones not only hear the stories of Scripture but begin to live them out—showing the love of Jesus in small but powerful ways.
