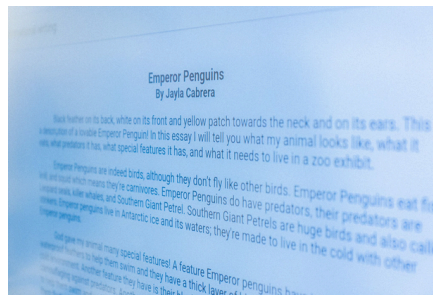


EXPLORING GOD'S CREATION

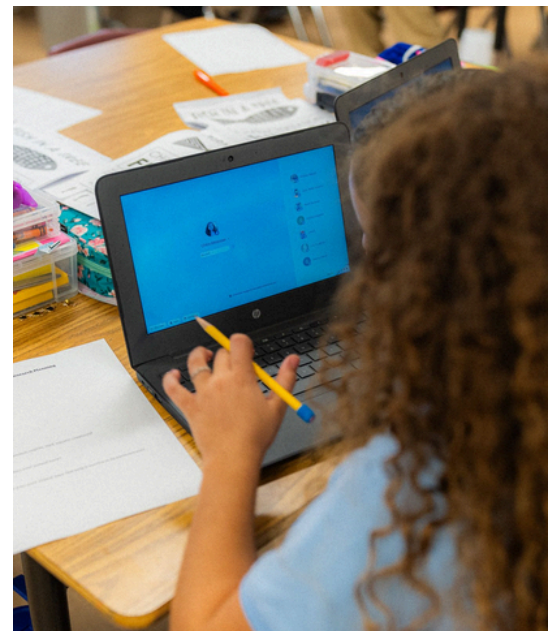
4th Grade Animal Research Project
