## SENTENCE STRUCTURE WITH TK

In our Transitional Kindergarten (TK) class, we continue our exciting journey of learning about sentence structure and how to build meaningful sentences. We have been focusing on the essential components of a complete sentence: a noun, which tells us who or what the sentence is about, and a verb, which describes what the subject is doing. This month, we embarked on a heartwarming writing project by attaching emotions to our writing, and this week's focus was on the emotion "love." With Valentine's Day just around the corner, it was the perfect opportunity to reflect on the meaning of love and explore the concept through our writing and creativity.

We began the project by discussing what love means to each of us, and how we experience love in our daily lives. A key part of our discussion revolved around Jesus' love for us all, reinforcing the values of kindness, compassion, and care.
